The mission of the global health program is to prepare professionals to apply public health frameworks, systems approaches, traditional medicine philosophy and cultural humility to improve the health and well-being of diverse populations worldwide through practice, research and policy.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The MScGH program offers a whole-systems approach to global health. Students are trained to view a broader context of health and medicine rooted in integrative medicine. Public health is the foundation of this degree, with additional emphasis in health disparities, social justice, cultural humility and traditional medicines. Graduates are equipped with the knowledge and skills to work within diverse cultural and multidisciplinary environments in local, national and international global health settings.

Students may choose to complete the program in one or two years, or take it concurrently with another degree program at NUNM.

EXPERIENCE TRIPS

To fully grasp the challenges and complexity of global health, our students travel! Global health experience trips provide an opportunity for students to immerse themselves in a culture different from their own and gain tangible experience in a practice-based setting. Locations include Thailand, Nicaragua, Tanzania, Ghana and New Mexico.

FIELDWORK

Life changing. That's what many of our students say about the fieldwork experience. The MScGH fieldwork component enables students to pursue practical experience locally, nationally or internationally with support and mentorship from expert faculty. Students develop a project in conjunction with a global health organization; projects involve diverse activities such as ethnographies, educational program development, secondary data analysis, environmental health assessment and community activism. Fieldwork projects can be used as a launch point for future employment. Students find the fieldwork experience meaningful and, did we mention, often life changing.



CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND OUTCOMES

Start with the end in mind. This is what we ask NUNM students to do, which may seem unusual, but we're not your average school. We want you prepared for a lifelong practice of activism, which starts before you step foot on campus.

We offer customized 1-1 career and business development support while you are at NUNM. Our career center exists to help our students and alumni succeed. 
FINANCIAL AID
