Master of Science in Global Health (MScGH) Program**

**GSGH 836E: Ghana Global Health Experience Course
Winter 2019, 4 credits**

OVERVIEW:

This course is an experience trip in Ghana, West Africa. The coursework covers topics in globalization, natural childbirth, maternal and child health, cultural humility, West African herbalism, clinical services in an international setting, and working with local Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) to empower and educate rural Ghanaian women. For students in clinical programs (ND, MSOM, DSOM), clinical shadowing hours may be applied toward preceptor hours or community education with prior approval. Itinerary-specific trip fee (\$2,300.00) applies.

Course Location:

West Africa: Accra, Ghana and surrounding areas

Course Dates:

Tuition and grades will be attached to winter 2019 Academic Term, but travel occurs during winter break. Additional course meetings may occur before (during fall 2018 term) and after (during winter 2019 term) travel dates.

Travel Dates:

December 16, 2018-December 30, 2018. **Travel must occur before and after these dates.**

To participate in this Global Health Experience course, student's must:

- Complete this application, interview with the course director, and be accepted to enroll in the course;
- Be in good academic standing;
- Have current personal health insurance coverage and provide documentation of this coverage
- Have completed NUNM required vaccinations within the past three years, excepting those that need to be updated annually;
- Complete any required vaccinations for travel to Ghana (see <https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel> for more information).
- Complete an online Travel Contract prior to departure;
- Have a valid, current passport;
- Have a valid, current travel visa (if required);
- Participate in mandatory pre-trip orientation meeting(s);



- Pre-register and then enroll in *GSGH 836E: Ghana Global Health Experience* course for 4 credits during winter 2019 term;
- Pay the trip deposit, trip fee balance and tuition; and
- Plan and pay for transportation to/from the course location in Ghana.

Course Expenses:

- A \$2,300.00 fee to cover the costs of in-country transportation, lodging, activities, and some food.
- Cost of airline travel to/from United States.
- Tuition for four credits

Note: Students who wish to participate in this travel-related course, but do not want to receive academic credit, will pay an administrative fee equal to 20% of the full tuition cost of the course. This option can be used only if space is available after all “for-credit” students have registered.

*** If you are a student taking this course to meet elective course requirements for your program - or you are enrolled in the MScGH program - you also may register for the GSGH 001: Global Health Experience Travel course during fall 2018 term. Registration in the GSGH 001 “course” will withdraw \$2000.00 from your financial aid allotment, which can be used to cover legitimate travel expenses related to the course.

Travel-Based (Trip) Course Fee Policy:

Students must apply, interview, and be accepted to travel-based courses. Once accepted, they will sign and submit an agreement to be registered for the travel, and are required to reserve their spot with a **50% deposit at the time of registration. The deposit for the Ghana course is \$1150.00 (50% of the \$2,300.00 trip fee).** The deposit will be charged to the student’s NUNM account. The deposit is used to make travel arrangements, including accommodations and other travel-related expenses. The travel deposit may be assessed several months prior to the trip itself.

After the travel deposit has been assessed, a student who wishes to drop the course must submit an add/drop form and is subject to the following refund rates:

- Deposits for travel-based courses will be refunded at 100% up to eight (8) weeks prior to the first day of class on-site in Ghana (Sunday, December 16, 2018), which is Sunday, October 21, 2018.
- **If the course is dropped within eight (8) weeks of the first day of class on-site (after October 21, 2018), the deposit is non-refundable.**
