



## DECISIONALLY IMPAIRED (DI) ADULTS FORM

Investigators proposing to include decisionally impaired (DI) adults are responsible for providing the IRB with information outlined below to facilitate an informed and timely review. When seeking IRB approval for research involving adults with impaired decision-making capacity and/or use of Authorized Representatives for Research, the investigator should address the following issues:

- 1. DI subjects asked to participate in this research may have the following type of limitation as defined by the National Bioethics Advisory Commission 1 (NBAC) (Check all that apply (a –d)):
  - a. Fluctuating decisional impairment
  - b. Progressive decisional impairment
  - c. Limited decisional impairment
  - d. Complete decisional impairment
- **2.** The proposed research is (check one classification, a or b):
  - a. Minimal risk indexed for the DI population
  - b. More than minimal risk indexed for the DI population (Check one): Expected direct benefit
