The mission of the global health program is to prepare professionals to apply public health frameworks, systems approaches, traditional medicine philosophy, and cultural humility to improve the health and well-being of diverse populations worldwide through practice, research and policy.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The MScGH program offers a whole-systems approach to global health. Students are trained to view a broader context of health and medicine rooted in integrative health. Public health is the foundation of this degree, with emphasis on social justice, cultural humility and traditional medicine. Graduates are equipped with the knowledge and skills to work within diverse cultural and multidisciplinary environments in local and national global health settings.

GLOBAL HEALTH EXPERIENCE TRIPS

To fully grasp the challenges and complexity of global health, our students travel! Global health experience trips provide an opportunity for students to immerse themselves in a culture different from their own and gain tangible experience in a practice-based setting. Locations include Thailand, Ghana, Tanzania, and a variety of other locations.

FIELDWORK

Life changing. That's what many of our students say about the fieldwork experience. The MScGH fieldwork component enables students to pursue practical experience locally, nationally or internationally with support and mentorship from expert faculty and on-site supervisors. Students develop a project in conjunction with a global health organization. Projects involve diverse activities such as program development, secondary data analysis, environmental health assessment, development and evaluation, and community activism. Fieldwork projects can be used as a launch point for future employment. Students find the fieldwork experience meaningful and, did we mention, life changing.



CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND OUTCOMES

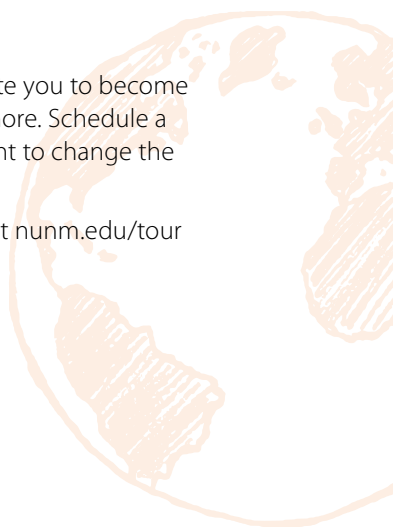
FINANCIAL AID
