Tuberculosis (TB) is a highly infectious, serious disease that is prevalent among certain populations in the United States and other countries, and presents a significant risk to health care workers exposed to patients who may have contracted TB. Health care facilities are required to ensure that employees exposed to at-risk populations are free of TB to prevent transmission of the disease. They are also required to identify employees who may have been exposed to TB prior to being hired.

NUNM applies this testing policy to students, employees, and volunteers, as the risk of working in a medical setting may be high. Non-degree seeking students are still considered "students" under the TB policy. All students must take a tuberculosis test to identify, isolate and refer persons with active TB to ensure the safety of students, staff, faculty and clinic patients. Incoming students, transfer students, students returning after leave of absence from over one year of leave and students who have traveled to areas of the world where TB in endemic as well as non-degree seeking students must be tested with the QuantiFERON Gold TB blood test.

The QuantiFERON Gold In-Tube blood test demonstrates the presence of antibodies in the blood to the tuberculosis bacteria, indicating exposure, but not necessarily active disease. If an employee, student, or volunteer has a positive blood test, they will be asked to have a chest x-ray to rule out active pulmonary disease in order to protect the college community. If the chest film is negative for active pulmonary disease, the individual will be allowed to remain on campus unless they develop clinical signs of active disease. Individuals with active pulmonary tuberculosis will not be allowed on campus until certified free of disease, in accordance with CDC policy. The QuantiFERON test is approved by the CDC as a reliable alternative to the traditional skin testing and has been adopted by NUNM as its preferred surveillance method. NUNM recommends that anyone who has spent time in high-risk countries, or extended time with at risk populations, be retested 8-10 weeks after exposure. A list of both high-risk countries and at risk populations can be found on the CDC website.

*Individuals who have been enrolled at NUNM within the last twelve months are not required to provide proof of TB test.

TB testing is available at the NUNM Health Centers – Lair Hill on 3025 SW Corbett St. Lab appointment required. For clinic and lab hours/lab fees, please call 503.552.1551. The TB surveillance coordinator will work with students who have a positive test.
