



The University of Washington in Seattle, Washington is seeking doctoral-level complementary and integrative health (CIH) practitioners to apply for the “T90 Clinical Research Training Program in Complementary and Integrative Health”. Eligible individuals include those who have received doctoral degrees in CIH disciplines **within the past 5 years** including: ND, DAOM, DC, DPT and DO, among others. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents.

The focus of this program is translational and clinical research in complementary and integrative health, including mind-body, natural products, nutrition, public health and health services research. The T90 program pairs trainees with experienced, funded, clinical researchers at UW who have active research projects. The program mentors represent five schools within the University of Washington, including the Schools of Medicine, Nursing, Public Health, Social Work and Pharmacy. T90 trainees receive didactic training in the methods and skills required to design and implement clinical research in the fields of CIH, along with other activities to support the development of independent research careers.

These positions are supported by an NIH grant entitled “*Building Research across Inter-Disciplinary Gaps (BRIDG)*” which provides up to three years of funding including salary, benefits, travel and research support.

This program is in collaboration with the National University of Natural Medicine (NUNM) in Portland, Oregon, which has a corresponding program for individuals with non-CIH degrees (e.g., PhDs, DrPH, etc.) and with conventional research backgrounds.

The BRIDG T90 training program is directed by Drs. Cathryn Booth-LaForce, PhD and Yvonne Lin, PhD at UW and Drs. Heather Zwickey, PhD and Ryan Bradley, ND, MPH at NUNM.

The BRIDG program is now accepting applications through May 2, 2022 for a September 2022 start date.
