CERTIFICATE OF IMMUNIZATION

Guide for incoming students



The Certificate of Immunization is a requirement for admission for all incoming students, and must be submitted prior to attending New Student Orientation. For questions, contact the Admissions Office at 503.552.1660 or admissions@nunm.edu.

I. Student Information

Complete this section in full.

II. Vaccination Information

Provide your vaccination history in one of the following ways:

- 1. Ask your primary care physician to complete the information directly on the form and sign in the authorized section;
- 2. Fill out the information and sign yourself, submitting proof of immunity (see below) along with the form.

Accepted forms of proof of immunity:

- Immunization records from a doctor's office
- Receipts showing date and type of immunization(s) given
- Official titer results confirming immunity (not accepted for Tdap) For titers returned not showing immunity, you will need to show proof of the necessary booster/vaccine.

You may also combine methods 1 and 2, if your PCP has certain records and you have others.

III. Medical Exemption

Students enrolling in a clinical program are required by state law to provide proof of immunity for all vaccinations. The <u>only</u> exception is a medical exemption. Have your PCP directly authorize and sign the certificate.

IV. Non-Medical Exemption

All students are encouraged to provide all immunizations, however students enrolling in a nonclinical program have the option to complete a non-medical exemption for some or all vaccines:

- 1. Watch the appropriate <u>vaccine education module</u>, print and sign the certification of completion, and return to NUNM Admissions.
 - Because the College Student module only covers the measles exemption, for HEP B, Tdap, or Varicella exemptions, you must watch the Parent/Guardian vaccine education module.
 - If you are seeking one of the above <u>and</u> a measles exemption, you only need to watch the Parent/Guardian module.
 - For a MMR (measles) exemption only, you may watch either the College Student module or the Parent/Guardian module.

Important immunization schedules and notes

[•] Hep B is a three-dose series that can take up to 6 months to complete. If you need to start at the beginning of the series, it's best to start as soon as possible so you complete your immunizations prior to orientation.

Tdap or TD must be completed within the last 10 years.
a. If your last Tdap was given at 18 years or older, your next booster shot can be with the Td
b. If your last Tdap was given at 17 years or younger, your next booster needs to be the Tdap.

[•] Varicella immunization may also be provided via medical documentation of a history of varicella or herpes zoster (shingles).
